Objectives and Investment Policy

The Junior Oils Trust aims to provide long-term capital growth from a global portfolio of small to medium capitalisation companies specialising in oil exploration and production.

There may be occasions in light of adverse market conditions where the Investment Manager chooses to hold a high level of bonds and government securities.

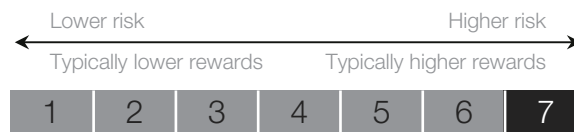
The Investment Adviser to the fund decides which investments to

buy and when within the constraints of the objectives and policy. The fund is not constrained by a benchmark.

The Junior Oils Trust does not pay income. Instead, any income received by the fund is reinvested back into the fund.

You can sell all or part of your investment on a daily basis subject to the minimum holding requirements.

Risk and Reward Profile



The risk and reward indicator above aims to provide you with an indication of the overall risk and reward profile of the fund. It is calculated based on the volatility of the fund using weekly historic returns over the last five years. If five years data is not available for a fund, the returns of a representative portfolio are used.

As the risk and reward indicator is calculated based on historical data it may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the fund. The risk category shown is not guaranteed and may change over time. The lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment. This fund has been measured as 7 because it has experienced very high volatility historically. The fund's volatility is affected by various factors including:

- The fund will be exposed to stock markets. Stock market prices can move irrationally and be affected unpredictably by diverse factors, including political and economic events.

- The fund will invest in the shares of smaller companies which are more volatile over shorter time periods.

Changes in exchange rates may affect the value of your investment.

- The fund has a concentrated portfolio which means greater exposure to a smaller number of securities than a more diversified portfolio. The fund may experience greater volatility as a result of this.

The fund invests mainly in the oil sector therefore investments will be vulnerable to sentiment in that sector. The fund may therefore be more volatile than more diversified funds.

Risks which are not adequately captured by the risk indicator include:

- In certain market conditions some assets in the fund may be less liquid and therefore more difficult to sell at their true value or in a timely manner.

Charges

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment. The ongoing charges figure is based on expenses for the year ending 31/08/2017. This figure may vary from year to year. It excludes:

- Portfolio transaction costs, except in the case of an entry/exit charge paid by the UCITS when buying or selling units in another collective investment undertaking.

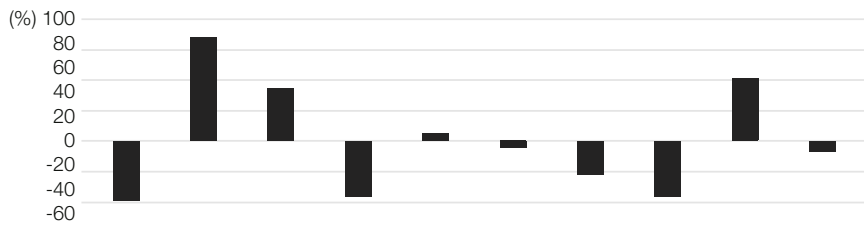
