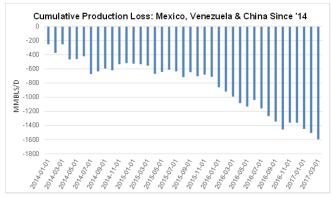

Dear Investor.

Commodities have been weak across the board in April and early May as concerns about the Chinese de-leveraging and the potential impact on demand weighed on markets. This week, the US\$1.7 trillion Chinese bond market inverted, for the first time ever since records begun, with 5-year yields rising above the 10-year benchmark. Rising cost of short-term debt in an economy where the reported debt to GDP ratio is about 260% is a sure way to cause economic activity to contract, with significant risks of a financial crisis as bad debts accumulate. Nevertheless, the International Energy Agency has maintained its expectation for demand growth for this year whilst acknowledging the growth in North American supply and greater exports from Libya and Nigeria could keep a lid on oil prices in the short term.

Recently reported large draws from inventories indicate that the supply-demand balance has been restored. Notwithstanding some short term trading volatility in oil prices due to the correlation with the commodities spectrum, we believe that the supply destruction caused by the two year oil crisis will support prices higher in the second half of the year. While North America's oil production grows again, there are mounting declines in other parts of the world. Supply could be short of demand by year-end.

The oil industry has rationalised, reduced its cost base, and focused on the lower marginal cost projects. Companies that survived the downturn with a solid capital base have taken advantage to acquire assets at low prices. These companies are steadily gaining the trust of investors and see their share prices re-rate. The Junior Oils Trust remains at the top of performance tables of energy funds over trailing 12 and 6 months, as smaller companies catch up.
